RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE

1. Students are required to be punctual at the stated hours for the classes.
Class Timings - Monday to Friday - 9.25 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.,
Lunch break 12.30 p.m. to 1.30 p.m. Saturday - 9.25 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.
2. 75% classroom attendance is compulsory in each subject to enable students to take up the Semester/Annual Examination. If the student fails to maintain the attendance, he/she shall repeat the whole semester / year.
3. Students can avail sick leave for three or more days only on medical grounds and this is to be informed to the Principal at the earliest which has to be certified by a Registered Medical Practitioner authorised by the Government.
4. Habitual late coming, irregular attendance for more than a day without intimation, prior permission or proper reason and avoiding internal tests will be viewed seriously.
5. In case of missing the class without the permission of the concerned Lecturer/Principal, action will be taken accordingly.
6. **In case a student discontinues his/her studies, he/she shall pay the fees for the entire course of study.**
7. Discourtesy towards lecturers/staff in word or act, irregular attendance, neglect of work, gross in subordination, misbehaviour within the college premises or outside etc. will be regarded as sufficient reason for punishment by the Principal, which even may be suspension or dismissal.
8. Smoking and consuming alcohol/drugs in the college premises is prohibited.
9. Students should not take part in any agitation, political or other wise directed against the authority of the government or the college. They are also forbidden to engage prominently in any public movement without the permission of the Principal.
10. Ragging is strictly prohibited.
11. Students are informed not to bring their friends employed or studying in other institutions inside the college campus.
12. Students must wear the college uniform and identity card on all working days & during exams.
13. Students are not allowed to bring four wheelers inside the Campus.
14. **Students are strictly prohibited from bringing Mobile Phones to the college. If any student is found bringing the mobile to the college strict disciplinary action will be taken, the mobile will be seized and fine will be imposed.**
15. SC/ST students can avail the reservation seats, scholarships & concession.
16. Students are expected to take part in all extra curricular, and co-curricular activities.
17. College will take serious note of any misbehaviour even outside the premises of the college. The college expects all the students to be good ambassadors of the college.
18. Students who are not living with their parents are required to reside with relatives or in hostels approved by the Principal.
19. Students having no classes shall not loiter in the veranda but are expected to spend time in the library; Students are not permitted to go to other classes without the Academic Advisor's permission.
20. Each class has an Academic Advisor who keeps a close watch on the students attendance, progress and conduct.
21. College office remains open for any transaction between 9 a.m. – 5.00 p.m. on all week days and between 9 a.m to 3 p.m on Saturdays. Application for Transfer/Conduct/Bonafide certificate etc should be given in the prescribed form available in the office atleast two days in advance with prescribed fees.
22. Students should not write, scratch on walls, desks or tables and damage the college property. If they are found indulging in such activities action will be taken.
23. Students should compulsorily be present on the first day of the college (each term) and on important occasions such as Student Council Inauguration, Sports day, College day. Failure to attend, fine will be imposed.
24. Leave note should be submitted to the concerned Class Teacher and there after to the concerned subject teacher on every hour/day's absence. Leave note should be signed by the parent/ guardian compulsorily.
25. Students who take part in various EC/CC activities should maintain a record of it in the space allotted in the diary and get signed by the concerned co-ordinator immediately.

FEE REGULATION

1. Fee should be paid on or before the last date prescribed by the Principal. Thereafter a defaulter is liable to pay fine, in addition to the fees, as decided by the Principal. If the term's fee is not paid on the last date prescribed, the defaulter's name will be struck off from the College rolls. If admitted thereafter, he shall pay a) the fees along with fine and b) the re-admission fees of Rs.500.
2. Re-Admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right.
3. The fees once paid will not be refunded if a student withdraws himself / herself after his / her admission or even after the payment of prescribed fees, he / she is dismissed by the Institution due to misbehaviour or non-co-operation of the student with Principal.
4. Even if a student's name is on the College register for only a part of the term, he is liable to pay the various fees for all the years of the **Entire Course**.
5. Selection of Candidate for scholarship and fee concessions will be made only on the basis of satisfactory progress, conduct, attendance and economic status.
6. Scholarship holders are expected to pay the installments on specified date and claim their scholarship when it is sanctioned.

COLLEGE EXAMINATION

1. Two tests, a mid term examination, a preparatory examination and an annual examination will be conducted in an academic year for PU Students. The performance of the students will be made known to the parents.
2. For degree students, in addition to the 'Internal' examinations, lecturers will hold test / assignments, to assess the students' progress.
3. No student shall absent him/herself from any examination/test/ assignment without obtaining in person, wherever possible, pre-sanction of leave from the Principal or in the case of class/ assignments from the Lecturer concerned.

LIBRARY RULES

1. The College Library has excellent collection of books, magazines, journals, e-books, e-journals and newspapers. The Library and Reading Room will be kept open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on all working days.
2. Admission to the Library is strictly by Identity Card. Mobile phones are banned inside the Library.
3. Books are issued to a student on possessing the Library Membership Card, for a period of four days only. Thereafter, fine of Rs.5/- is imposed on every additional day's delay.
4. Students who borrow books are held responsible for any damage done to them. They shall not write or make any mark in them.
5. Books borrowed from the Library may not be lent to anyone else.
6. Strict silence must be observed in the Library and along the corridor leading to the Library.
7. Polite ways, cordial attitude and eager interest must mark students' behaviour in the Library.
8. The Librarian/Assistant Librarian may be approached for all matters concerning the Library.
9. Disregard of Library rules, disrespectful manner towards the Library staff, or any other type of unbecoming conduct in the Library, will be liable to disciplinary action.
10. During University Examination, books can be borrowed by paying deposit of Rs. 150 per card, and while returning Rs. 20 per card will be deducted from their respective deposit.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

1. Kindly remember that the college has introduced several rules and regulations for the smooth functioning of the college and in the interest of students. Your co-operation is required in their implementation.
2. Sign the Record of Absence (given in the Calendar), in case your ward absents himself / herself from the college. In case of a long absence, due to illness leave note must be supported by a medical certificate.
3. You will have to meet the Academic Advisor / Mentor of your ward atleast twice a year, once at the beginning of the academic year and next during November / December. In addition, you may contact the Principal or Mentors / Academic Advisors when required.
4. Do not give Mobile Phone to your ward while coming to the college. Mobile phone found to be in possession of your ward will be ceased and disciplinary action will be taken against him/her. Moreover, you will be asked to meet the Principal in such event.
5. Instruct your ward to strictly adhere to the college dress code.
6. If at all the college organises a picnic, information will be given to the parents and their consent will be asked. Students are not permitted to go on picnic or tour unless they are accompanied by their Academic Advisor or any other Teacher. You will have to give your consent in writing and also give an undertaking owing the responsibility for any untoward incident that may take place during such picnic / tour.
7. Kindly note that the College sends regular information regarding your ward's absence to the college / participation in various extra-curricular activities in various colleges. Hence, whenever your contact number / address is changed, please inform us.
8. If you are called to discuss about your ward, please come and meet the concerned teacher.
9. Encourage your ward to take part in various co-curricular and extra curricular activities offered by the college. This is to improve the overall personality development of your ward.
